

The Problem...Funding!


Revenue sources were down since 2003

- Gas taxes did not increase from 1997 to 2015.
- Grants are increasingly competitive
- Construction inflation & higher material fuel prices & the "Triple Whammy" Effect:
 - 1. Operating costs UP
 - 2. Construction material costs UP
 - 3. Revenues DOWN
- Net effects:
 - Defer improvements & maintenance
 - Make cuts in projects
 - Increased pressure on local governments for revenues
 - People are unhappy!






State of Michigan Road Funding



Where does the money you pay at the pump go?


2015 Road Funding Legislation

- Gas tax increased to 26.3¢ in 2016 and to 28.3¢ in 2023
 - Gas & diesel parity
 - Was 19¢ for 20 years!
- Registration fees up 20%
- Fuel Efficiency?
- Electric Vehicles?
- Typical Michigan car owner driving an average of 15,000 miles a year, total state and federal road-users fee's are \$413 a year.



MTF Revenue Trend


30-year History of MTF Revenues

Michigan Transportation Fund (MTF)



• Key:

Road agencies have no authority to raise significant revenues

Michigan Transportation Fund: Important things to know...

Any MTF dollars used for local road construction <u>must</u> be matched dollar for dollar from "other sources"

its own name and the agreement may provide for joint participation in the costs.

(15) Money distributed from the Michigan transportation fund may be expended for construction purposes on county local roads only to the extent matched by money from other sources. However, Michigan transportation funds may be expended for the construction of bridges on the county local roads in an amount not to exceed 75% of the cost of the construction of local road bridges.

Many counties do not provide *any* match for local road improvements:

Most other counties cap their annual contribution

Policy No. 8590 Local Road Improvement Funding Program

<u>Township match of 70%</u>

- <u>Road Construction (paving gravel</u> roads)
- <u>Resurfacing (re-paving bituminous</u> <u>roads</u>)
- <u>Heavy Maintenance (wedging and chipping bituminous roads)</u>
- Seal Coating

Township match of 50%

- <u>Re-gravelling</u>
- Bridge Replacement
- <u>Culvert Replacement</u> Culvert projects under the road equal to forty-eight inches (48") or more in diameter.

What is JCDOT doing now?

- JCDOT is doing its best to continue maintenance with the funds available
- JCDOT applies for all grants available
- Roads continue to deteriorate
- The cost of repairing the roads is increasing year after year, at a rate higher than general inflation



- Safety Grants
- Local Bridge Grants
- TAP Grants
- Economic Development Grants
- Federal BUILD/RAISE Grants
- Special Appropriations Funds

HOWEVER, local roads are generally not eligible for grants, except for bridges and limited safety funds


2017 - 2023 Norvell Township (JCDOT-Funded Projects)






MDOT Major Roadway Projects



Interesting Facts

- Road network breakdown (10th largest road network)
 - MDOT 8%
 - Counties 74%
 - 4rd Largest local road network
 - City/Villages 18%
- MDOT receives 75% of federal Funding
 - The balance is divided between 83 Counties and 533 City/Villages
- Cannabis Tax
 - Sales = ~\$1.7 Billion
 - \$49 Million deposited in MTF
 - Jackson received ~\$329,390
- Miles of Road
 - Primary 547
 - Local 830 paved & 231 gravel
 - Bridges 64
 - MDOT contract 561
