The following is the basis and criteria for the Tax Exempt Status for Nonprofit Religious and Charitable organizations according to the Michigan State Constitution the Michigan State General Property Tax Act:

Constitutional Exemptions

Article IX, Section 4:

Exemption of Religious or Educational Non-profit Organizations

Property **owned and occupied** by nonprofit religious or educational organizations and used **exclusively** for religious or educational purposes, as defined by law, shall be exempt from real and personal property taxes.

PA 206 of 1893 General Property Tax Act

MCL 211.7o

Charitable Institutions; Qualified Conservation Organizations; Fraternal Societies; Homes for Aged and Chronically Ill (Real and Personal)

Real estate or personal property **owned and occupied** by nonprofit charitable institutions incorporated under the laws of this state with the building and other property thereon while **occupied by them solely for the purposes for which they were incorporated**; qualified conservation organizations that are held for conservation purposes and open to all residents of this state; and charitable home of fraternal or secret societies and nonprofit organizations whose stock is wholly owned by religious or fraternal societies which own and operate facilities for the aged and chronically ill, in which the **net income from the operation of the corporations does not inure to the benefit of any person other than the residents** is exempt under this act.

Churches and Parsonages (Real and Personal)

Houses of public worship, with the land on which they stand, the furniture therein and all rights in the pews, and any parsonage owned by a religious society of this state and **occupied as a**

parsonage are exempt from taxation under this act. Houses of public worship include buildings or other facilities owned by a religious society and **used predominantly for religious services or for teaching the religious truths and beliefs of the society.**
